

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Exhibits will only be received by the Pakenham & District Agricultural and Horticultural Society Inc. subject to the rules and conditions hereinafter set out and to the rules of the Society, which may be inspected at the Secretary's office.

The Committee of the Society, the Secretary or the Chief Steward of a particular class or section shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

(a) Reject or cancel any entry at any time.

(b) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.

(c) Cancel any event or class.

(d) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place.

(e) Alter the conditions of any event.

(f) Remove any exhibit from the Show Grounds.

(g) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries to any section or class or for any particular exhibit.

(h) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.

The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

The exhibitor enters entirely at their own risk. In case any exhibit whilst on the Society's Show Grounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits. The exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.

The decision of the Judges shall be final and without appeal to law or otherwise, subject to the eligibility of the exhibit.

Judges may award a second prize instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not considered worthy.

Protests (if any) against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 6 pm on the day such awards are made, together with a deposit of ten dollars (\$10.00), which shall be forfeited to the Society if the protest is found, after due consideration, to be unfounded and frivolous.

Unless you indicate your preference not to receive such material (see below), we may also use this information to update you on upcoming events to be run by the PDAHS, such as the **2025 Pakenham Show**.

We may disclose information about you to medical practitioners and other health service providers attending the Show if required. We may disclose information about you to the media for the purpose of publishing articles on your participation at the Show. We may disclose information about you to insurance providers for the purposes of arranging applicable insurance for you or making a claim on PDAHS' insurance in relation to incidents and accidents that occur at the Show. We may disclose information about you to the Equestrian Federation of Australia and VAS to assess your qualification and eligibility for other events. If legal, health or safety issues arise, we may be required to disclose information to relevant organisations who deal with these matters.

You have some rights to access personal information that we hold about you. Ingredients: Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

250g sultanas	250g chopped raisins
250g currants	125g chopped mixed peel
90g chopped glace cherries,	90g chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	250g plain flour
60g self-raising flour	¹ / ₄ tspn grated nutmeg
¹ / ₂ tspn ground ginger,	¹ / ₂ tspn ground cloves
250g butter	250g soft brown sugar
1/2 tspn vanilla essence,	¹ / ₂ tspn almond essence
¹ / ₂ tspn lemon essence OR finel	y grated lemon rind
4 large eggs	

Method:

- 1. Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover, leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter 2. and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- 3. Place the mixture into a prepared square tin, 20cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3¹/₂-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the **Note: "Rounded tin corners" does not qualify. tin.

V2 VAS Ltd CARROT CAKE

Ingredients:

- 375g Plain Flour 1 1/2 tspn bicarb soda $\frac{1}{2}$ tspn ground nutmeg Pinch of salt 350 ml vegetable oil
- 2 tspn baking powder 2 tspn ground cinnamon ¹/₂ tspn allspice 345g castor sugar 4 eggs

3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)

220g tin crushed pineapple, drained, 180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed Method.

- Preheat the oven to 180 degrees C (160C fan). Grease a 23cm 1 (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2 Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple & pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
- 4 Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend & allow to cool on wire rack.

V3 VAS Ltd JUNIOR Boiled Fruit Cake

(Open to junior bakers under 18 yrs on Show Day) State Final prizes:

Ingredients: Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

375g mixed fruit	³ ⁄ ₄ cup brown sugar
1 tspn mixed spice	¹ / ₂ cup water
125g butter	¹ / ₂ tspn bicarbonate soda
¹ / ₂ cup sherry	2 eggs, lightly beaten
2 tbspns marmalade,	1 cup self-raising flour
1 cup plain flour	¼ tspn salt

Method:

- 1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to boil.
- Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add 2 bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
- Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and 3. lined 20cm round cake tin.
- 4 Bake in a moderately slow oven, for 11/2 hours or until cooked when tested.

Ingredients:

- 2 ¹/₂ cups self-raising flour,
- ¹/₄ tspn ground nutmeg,
- 1 cup coarsely grated carrot
- 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten 1 tblspn orange marmalade
 - 1 cup reduced fat milk
 - 1 cup canola oil,

3/4 cup orange juice 1/3 cup of chopped in half sultanas

Method:

- Heat oven to 190C (moderately hot). 1.
- Line and spray a 12-hole muffin pan with large paper cases-2. Classic white muffin case size (35mm Height x 80mm Wide x 50mm Base).
- Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates and carrots. 3. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
- 4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
- Cook for 20 minutes. To test muffins are cooked insert cake 5. skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
- Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool. 6.
